Venice - Corfu - Santorini - Kusadasi - Mykonos - Cannakale - Istanbul

Venice, Italy (overnight)

It's called La Serenissima, "the most serene," a reference to the majesty, wisdom, and monstrous power of this city that was for centuries the unrivaled mistress of trade between Europe and the Orient and the bulwark of Christendom against the tides of Ottoman expansion. Built entirely on water by men who defied the sea, Venice is unlike any other town. Its landmarks, the Basilica di San Marco and the Palazzo Ducale, are exotic mixes of Byzantine, Gothic, and Renaissance styles.

Corfu, Greece

Kerkyra (Corfu) is the greenest and, quite possibly, the prettiest of all Greek islands—emerald mountains, ocher and pink buildings, shimmering silver olive leaves. The turquoise waters lap rocky coves and bougainvillea, scarlet roses, and wisteria spread over cottages. This northernmost of the major Ionian islands has, through the centuries, inspired artists, conquerors, royalty, and, of course, tourists. It's hard to believe that any island so small could generate a history so large. Classical remains vie with architecture from the centuries of Venetian, French, and British rule, leaving Corfu with a pleasant combination of contrasting design elements.

Santorini, Greece

Undoubtedly the most extraordinary island in the Aegean, crescent-shape Santorini remains a mandatory stop on the Cycladic tourist route. Arriving by boat, you are met by one of the world's truly breathtaking sights, the caldera: a crescent of cliffs, rising 1,100 feet, with the white clusters of the towns of Fira and Ia perched along the top. The encircling cliffs are the ancient rim of a still-active volcano, and you are sailing east across its flooded caldera.

Kusadasi, Turkey

The central and southern Aegean is probably the most developed area of Turkey, and the rolling hills, mountains surrounded by clear blue seas, and glorious white-sand beaches are just a few of the reasons why. Wandering through historic ruins, boating, scuba diving, basking in the Anatolian sun, and eating fresh fish are just some of the ways you can fill your day. Although very developed,

Kuşadasi is also the stepping stone to some of Turkey's most important ancient sites, including Ephesus and the early Christian site of Meryemana.

Mykonos, Greece

Put firmly on the map by Jackie O, Mykonos has become one of the most popular of the Aegean islands. Travelers from all over the world are drawn to its sandy beaches, thatched windmills, and the picturesque, whitewashed port town, whose cubical two-story houses and churches have been long celebrated as some of the best examples of classic Cycladic architecture. This is a must-visit site for anyone interested in ancient history.

Cannakale, Istanbul

Canakkale, the main city of the province of the same name, is situated on both sides of the Dardanelles, and its shores touch both Europe and Asia Minor. Since ancient times, Canakkale has been strategically significant as a crossover point for migrants, traders and armies. Its two most important battles occurred during the mythological War of Troy, immortalised by Homer in his Iliad, and during World War I, when Mustafa Kemal Atatürk and his Turkish troops defended the region against enemy forces. Visitors to Canakkale come here to see the modern Trojan horse that has been erected at the site of Troy as the symbol of the fabled war, and to view the nearby battlefields and war memorials of Gallipoli.

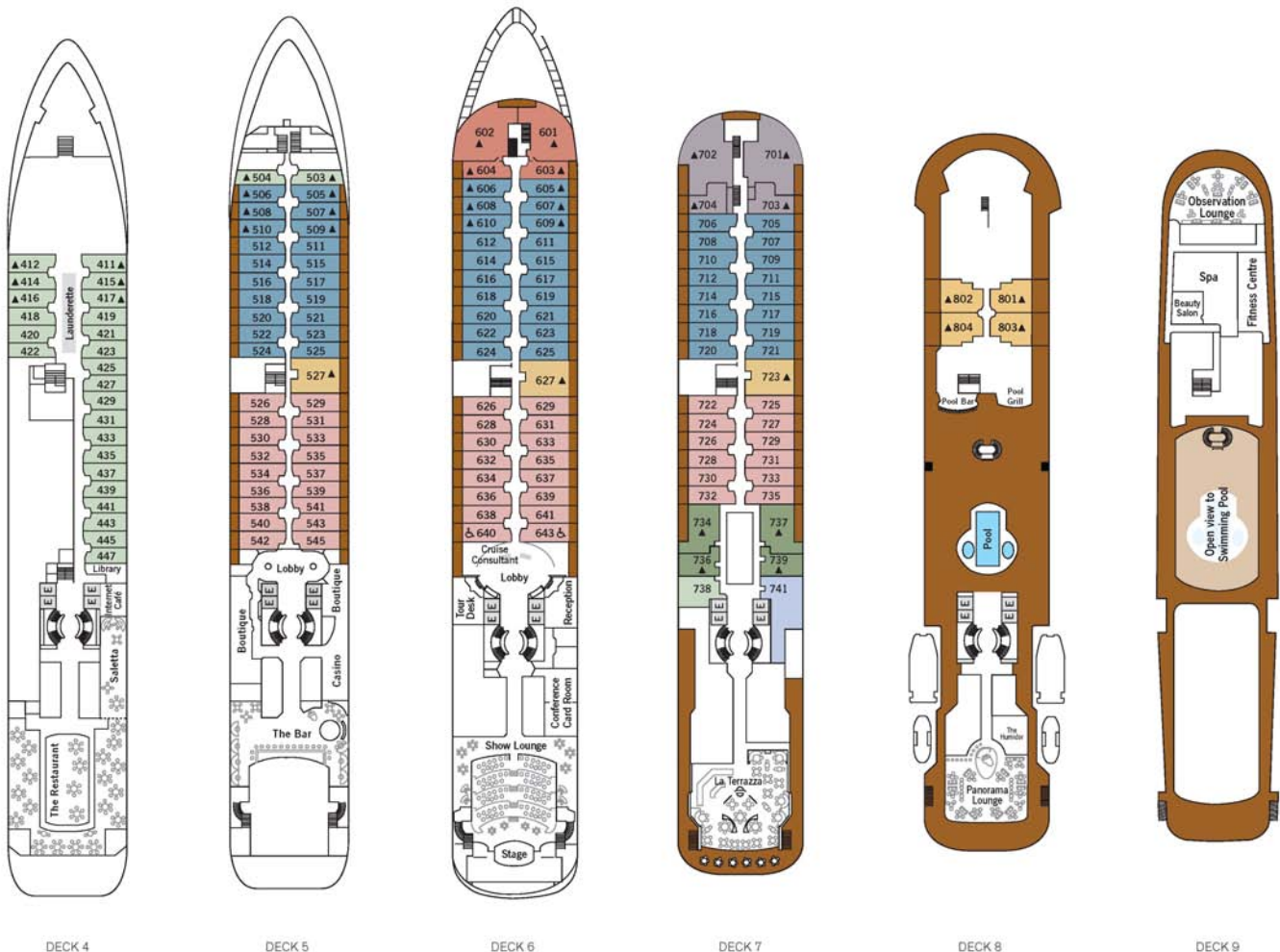
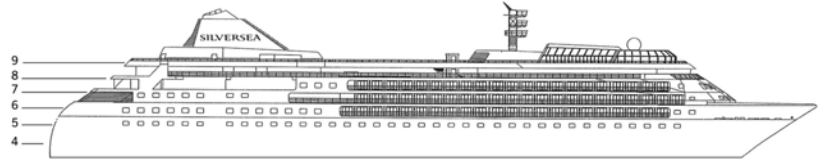
Istanbul, Turkey

Though it is often remarked that Turkey straddles Europe and Asia, it's really the city of Istanbul that does the straddling. European Istanbul is separated from its Asian suburbs by the Bosphorus, the narrow channel of water that connects the Black Sea, north of the city, to the Sea of Marmara in the south. Striking is the juxtaposition of the old and the new, of tradition and modernity. Office towers creep up behind historic old palaces; women in jeans or elegant designer outfits pass others wearing long skirts and head coverings; donkey-drawn carts vie with shiny BMWs for dominance of the streets; and the Grand Bazaar competes with Western-style boutiques and shopping malls.
